

This motivation letter (page 2/2 of the application form) is to be submitted together with the application form, a transcript of records, and a CV. Your letter can be either in English or German and should not exceed one page.

### Guidelines

<b>Erasmus+ / Why?</b>	Why would you like to participate in an ERASMUS+ exchange? (aside from the ECTS offered for it in the PO, that is). Explain your reasons for choosing to go abroad.
<b>Study place preference</b>	Which university shall it be? Think about which university you'd like to go to and why. We currently have two partner universities that you can rank on the form. Address only your <b>first choice</b> in your letter.
<b>Relevance to your specialisation</b>	To what extent is your first choice related to your specialisation? Check out the <b>homepage of your first choice</b> . Are there any courses that specifically match your specialisation or are of particular interest to you? What characterises the partner university for you?
<b>Relevance to your personal situation</b>	You've always wanted to live in the specific country? You grew up somewhere very similar to the city of the university, and that's why you want to experience something new? Mention such things in your letter.
<b>Avoid travel clichés</b>	You should focus on subject-specific and educational/social programmes offered by the partner university. Avoid common travel guide clichés such as "you can ski well there" or "the chocolate is heavenly".
