# § 1 Course Outline

- (1) The research-oriented and consecutive master's program Linguistik Sprache, Kommunikation und Kognition/Linguistics - Language, Communication and Cognition is offered jointly by the linguistic departments of the Faculty of Philology and the Center of Cognitive Science of the Institute of Psychology. The program aims to explore language and its forms and functions, its variability, its history and development, its cognitive prerequisites and conditions, and its communicative achievements. It offers students the possibility of individual specialization in one of the following six fields: English Language and Linguistics, General Linguistics and Linguistic Diversity, German Linguistics, Romance Linguistics, Slavic Linguistics, or Language and Cognition. When choosing the specialization English Language and Linguistics or General Linguistics and Linguistic Diversity, there is the option of completing the degree exclusively in English. Within their chosen specialization and in two supplementary modules in linguistics, students acquire differentiated knowledge and advanced skills in central subject areas of linguistics. These include issues of language structure, questions of linguistic variation, language change and linguistic interaction, as well as the connection between language and cognition. In addition, students acquire advanced competencies in empirical research methods, which they can apply in projects within their chosen field. The master's program gives graduates with outstanding results the opportunity to enter an academic career. Students are also being prepared for occupational fields that require a professional approach to language, texts and communication as well as very good analytical skills (e.g., journalistic work with media, public relations, technical documentation).
- (2) 120 ECTS credits must be gained in the master's program Linguistics Language, Communication and Cognition.

# § 2 Course Structure

The master's program Linguistik - Sprache, Kommunikation und Cognition/Linguistics - Language, Communication and Cognition is divided into the following areas: Research Methods and Research Practice, the Specialization Domain, and Linguistic Supplementary Domain. In the Specialization Domain, students must choose one of the following six specializations: English Language and Linguistics, General Linguistics and Linguistic Diversity, German Linguistics, Romance Linguistics, Slavic Linguistics, or Language and Cognition. The chosen specialization is always the specialization fixed in the admission procedure. Upon request, the Examination Committee may allow a change of specialization, provided that the student fulfills the admission requirements for the desired new specialization.

## § 3 Language of Instruction and Examination

- (1) In the Research Methods and Research Practice area as well as in the Linguistic Supplementary Domain, classes are held in German or English. In the two specializations English Language and Linguistics and General Linguistics and Linguistic Diversity, classes are taught in English. Unless otherwise announced in the course catalog, classes in the other four specializations (German Linguistics, Romance Linguistics, Slavic Linguistics, and Language and Cognition) are taught in German.
- (2) The accompanying course and examination requirements must be completed in German or English or in the language in which the course in question is held, as specified by the course instructor or the examiner.
- (3) If the specializations English Language and Linguistics or General Linguistics and Linguistic Diversity

are chosen, all required modules in the master's program Linguistik - Sprache, Kommunikation und Kognition/Linguistics - Language, Communication and Cognition can be completed entirely in English.

In consultation with the responsible subject representative, one or more courses/programs with a total of 16 ECTS credits must be completed.

## Linguistische Vorträge/Linguistic Presentations

Eight lectures on linguistic topics must be attended. The lectures are selected with the approval of the responsible subject representative. Especially lectures offered by the Hermann Paul Center for Linguistics or the Hermann Paul School of Linguistics are recommended. The responsible subject representative will determine which course work is to be completed as part of the preparation and follow-up of the linguistic lectures.

## Wissenschaftliche Konferenz oder Workshop/Academic Conference or Workshop

An academic conference or an academic workshop on a program-relevant topic must be attended. The conference or workshop is selected with the approval of the responsible subject representative. The responsible subject representative determines which course work is to be completed for the conference or workshop.

#### Summer School

A program-relevant Summer School is selected with the approval of the responsible subject representative. The responsible subject representative determines which course work is to be completed for the Summer School.

#### Exkursion/Excursion

A program-relevant excursion lasting at least five days must be completed. The responsible subject representative will determine what course work is to be completed as part of the preparation and follow-up, as well as during the excursion.

# Studienprojekt/Study Project

A program-relevant study project must be developed independently. It is planned, carried out and evaluated in consultation with the responsible subject representative. The course work to be completed for the study project must be agreed upon with the responsible subject representative. It is a prerequisite for the recognition of the study project that the student has completed the agreed course work.

#### Internship

The internship should have a duration of at least five and a maximum of ten weeks and should be completed at a suitable public or private institution that is active in a field relevant to the Master's program 'Linguistics - Language, Communication and Cognition' and that guarantees the student's continuous participation in activities with an academic requirement profile. The duration, implementation and evaluation of the internship must be agreed upon in writing with the institution in question and with the University of Freiburg representative supervising the student. It is a prerequisite for the recognition of the internship that the student provides prove of their active participation in the form of a certificate from the institution and submits a written report about their activities.

## Studien- oder Forschungsaufenthalt/Study or Research Stay

Students must complete a study or research stay of at least twelve weeks at a teaching or research institution that is active in a field relevant to the Master's program 'Linguistics - Language, Communication and Cognition'. The institution is selected with the approval of the relevant subject representative. The responsible subject representative determines which course work must be completed as part of the study or research stay.

#### § 6 Master's thesis and oral master's examination

- (1) The Master's thesis has to be written on a topic from the subject area chosen as the Specialization Domain. If the specialization English Language and Linguistics or General Linguistics and Linguistic Diversity has been chosen, the Master's thesis must be written in English. 25 ECTS credits are awarded for the successful completion of the Master's thesis.
- (2) The oral master's examination (about 45 minutes) addresses the hypotheses, results and methods of the Master's thesis as well as its broader academic field. In the specializations English Language and Linguistics and General Linguistics and Linguistic Diversity, the oral master's examination is conducted in English. 5 ECTS credits will be awarded for the successful completion of the oral master's examination.

Transitional provision in the general examination regulations:

# § 29a Transitional provisions

(#) Students who have already started their studies at the University of Freiburg in the Master of Arts degree program English Language and Linguistics, German Linguistics or Linguistik/Linguistics prior to October 1, 2023, may complete these courses in accordance with the subject-specific provisions of the respective examination regulations from September 16, 2002, as amended by the Thirty-Second Amendment Statutes of September 29, 2017 (Official Announcements Jg. 48, No. 57, pp. 258-274), no later than September 30, 2026.
